SCBA/ELECTION/2017-18/

IMPORTANT RULES & GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED FOR THE ENSUING ELECTION 2018-2019

RULE 17: Election

The Office Bearers of the Association shall be elected by Secret Ballot and the other members of the Committee shall be elected by secret ballot by single distributive votes at the Annual Election. No Office Bearers or member of the Committee shall be eligible to hold any office for more than two consecutive years. Canvassing in any form on the date of polling is prohibited.

RULE 17-A: Election Committee

Election to the Association shall be conducted by an Election Committee of 3 members to be nominated by the Executive Committee of the Association. The members of the Election Committee shall not participate in the election, except casting their votes. The Election Committee shall exercise full and absolute control over the election and its decision shall be final and binding.

RULE 18: Eligibility of Member to Contest and Vote at Elections.

- I) No members of the Association shall be eligible to contest for any post of the Association unless:-
- (a) He/she paid his/her subscription, payable annually, on or before the last day of February of the year in which the elections are to be held.
- (b) He/she pays by Cheque/DD/Pay Order alongwith his/her nomination form the sum mentioned against the post for which he/she is seeking election which follows:-

President : Rs. 5000/- Vice-President : Rs. 4000/-Hony. Secretary : Rs. 3000/- Other Office Bearers : Rs. 3000/-Senior Member : Rs. 1000/-

Ex. Committee : Rs. 2000/-

Members whose nominations are rejected on scrutiny and/ or who withdraw their nominations by withdrawal date will be entitled to a refund of the above amount.

I-A The aforesaid Rule has to be read along with the resolution of the General Body passed on 28th September, 2004 which is extracted herein below:-

"He/She must have five years standing at the Bar for contesting for the post of the Office Bearers and three years standing at the Bar for the post of Executive Member. Seniority will be from the date of enrolment as Member of Supreme Court Bar Association."

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- II) No members shall be eligible to cast his/her vote at the election unless:-
- (i) He/She is in possession of Identity Card at the time of casting his/her vote and shows it on demand, if so required.
- (ii) He/She has paid his/her subscription by or before the LAST DAY of February of the Calendar Year in which the elections are being held and is NOT IN ARREARS ON ANY ACCOUNT.
- (iii) A member who is in arrears of his/her subscription or any dues to the Bar Association will not be eligible, to propose or second the candidature of any members to any of the post. Such member shall not be entitled to contest the election.
- (iv) Non-Active Members and Associate Members shall not have right to vote.

NOTE:- The aforesaid Rule has to be read along with the resolution of the General Body passed on February 18th, 2005 which is extracted herein below:-

RESOLUTION NO. 18-III:-

"A member who exercise his right to vote in any year in any High Court or District Court Advocates'/Bar Association election shall not be eligible to contest for any post of the Association or to cast his/her vote at the election. Every member before casting his/her vote shall in the prescribed form give a declaration that he/she is not voting in any other election of any High Court/District Court Bar Association. Provided, however, that if such a declaration is found to be false, it shall entail automatic suspension of the member giving such false declaration from membership of this Association for a period of three years."

The SCBA has prepared a list of Voters based on the questionnaire/permanent declaration made by the members. Only such members whose names are included in the final voters list shall be entitled to vote, contest, propose and second any candidate in SCBA Election-2018-2019.

RULE 18-A: A person who becomes a member of the Association after 15th January in a Calendar Year will not be entitled to take part in any elections held in that calendar year in any manner or to vote thereat or to stand for election or propose or second any member to the Committee or any office of the Association thereat.

RESOLUTION DT.14.10.2014 PURSUANT TO RULE 39:

	he Election Committee has also finalised the norms of the nomination paper and declaration in a second control of amended Rule 22 to the following effect:
yea	in my whole life time as member of Executive Committee of this Association as per led Rule in terms of Rule 39 (as amended in General Body Meeting dated 14.10.2014)."

Resolved that no member of the Bar shall be eligible to hold any one post for more than 4 years in his/her life time.

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GUIDELINES FOR THE ELECTIONS, 2018-2019 OF THE SCBA.

- 1. A candidate may file upto 2 nomination papers for a post. A nomination paper/set of nomination papers must be accompanied by a D.D. / Local Cheque towards deposit as per Rule 18 given overleaf. Failure of the candidate to pay the deposit alongwith the nomination paper(s) will make the nomination invalid. Nomination will only be valid subject to encashment of D.D./ Cheque. Cheques/Draft may preferably be of UCO Bank, Supreme Court.
- 2. A candidate shall be proposed or seconded only by members whose names are included in the final voters list.
- 3. NO voter shall propose or second more than one candidate for a post.
- 4. Nominations may be filed for more than one post by a candidate, provided each such nomination is accompanied separately by the deposit as specified in Rule 18 and complies with other formalities. However, a candidate can contest for only ONE POST.
- 5. A candidate who has filed nomination for more than one post shall withdraw, nominations for post/posts except the one which he/she intends to contest, within the time specified for withdrawal and failure to do so shall disqualify him/her from contesting the election for any of the posts and his/her deposit(s) shall be forfeited.
- 6. Candidates whose nominations are rejected on scrutiny/and/or those who withdraw their nominations by the last date of withdrawal will be entitled to refund of the deposit amount.
- 7. It will be the sole responsibility of the candidate to see that his/her nomination are properly filed, duly proposed and seconded by the members whose names are included in the final voters list with their signatures. The office will not be responsible if the form is found to be incomplete in any respect.
- 8. All voters must be in possession of Identity Card and produce the same at the time of issue of Ballot Paper and whenever required by the polling personnel.
- 9. Contesting candidates will be supplied one copy of voter list FREE at the time of filing nomination form. For extra copy, Rs. 100/- will be charged.
- 10. All campaigning shall be stopped at the end of the debate on Tuesday, 11th December, 2018 and there shall be no campaigning in any form thereafter including by away of SMSs.
- 11. Crowding and/or oral request by the candidate and/or his/her agent/supporter on the date of polling is strictly prohibited in the entire Supreme Court premises. The candidate and/ or his/ her agent/ supporter shall not impede or obstruct in any manner the entry points to the Supreme Court premises (both the main entry gate and the security barrier).
- 12. Any candidate or his/her agent found violating these guidelines and the model code of conduct will be rendered liable for disgualification.

The elected Executive Committee has decided to act in the best interest of the Association and work in an objective and transparent manner and has taken several steps in this regard. I took charge of SCBA on 15.12.2017 as Hony. Secretary, since then I have tried to jot down points and issues where there have been positive achievements and for this reason, time to time I raised several issues relating to SCBA like allotment of Chambers, Listing, Medical facilities etc. before the Competent Authority.

I am trying to provide better services and environment to our members. I wish to thank the Respected Members of the Bar for giving me an opportunity and I have performed as Hony. Secretary in positive direction and always tried my best to serve this August Bar.

I sincerely thank and grateful to President and Vice President, Office Bearers and all the Executive Committee Members for their unconditional support and valuable suggestion time to time.

Activities of the Association During our tenure

ISSUES PERTAINING TO THE SUPREME COURT REGISTRY

- We requested Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India, first, regarding entry of Advocates from Gate 'F' (near Museum), which was rejected four times by the Hon'ble Judges Security Committee and was a decade old demand of SCBA; Secondly, regarding our Clerks holding Proximity Cards be allowed to carry their mobile phones inside the Court Rooms, in silent mode.
 Both our demands were accepted. Gate "F" near Pragati Maidan Metro Station has been opened for Advocates now.
- Two dedicated Miscellaneous Counters made functional for the Members/Advocates at the Filing Counter.
- The Lift No.11 near Library-I is now functioning with new look.
- 10 exhaust fans & 15 wall fans installed in M.C. Setalvad Chambers Block basement, as members' lockers are kept there. Also the same was white washed twice.
- 5 wall mounted fans installed each at the entry points where security personnel are sitting at the M.C. Setalvad Lawyers Chambers Block and C.K. Daphtary Chambers Block.
- In Court No.5, Display Board fixed at an appropriate place, now member can see and watch Display Board from anywhere in aforesaid Court. I also made a request that Display Boards of rest of the Court Rooms should also be installed at an appropriate place, as fixed in Court No.5.
- Issuance of Two Wheeler Parking Stickers to Clerks of members of the Bar, which was not given last year.

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- Seat benches provided in front of SCBA Library-I
- Yellow Line marked in between C Gate and D Gate Parking Lots for convenience of the members of the Bar and optimal utilisation of the space available.

Listing Proforma

Listing Proforma has been re-casted, especially the column similar/pending matter.

Chambers

The Supreme Court Bar Association has been allotted 0.5 Acre of Land behind Petrol Pump near I.T.O. Further, Hon'ble Chief Justice of India directed the Ld. Secretary General to define formalities and to finalise the same so that the Chambers Construction may start at the earliest.

Appu Ghar Chambers Block:

As per the oral instructions by the Registry Officials, with the current pace, it is likely that the Appu Ghar Chambers Block shall be ready for delivery for possession by February, 2019.

Chambers Allotment Cases

In Chambers Allotment matters, Hon'ble the Supreme Court of India passed the Judgment dated 25.10.2018, in Writ Petition (C) No. 745/2018 & connected matters, filed by the Members, in which the criteria for Chambers Allotment was decided.

On 30.10.2018, SCBA has filed an Application for modification in judgment dated 25.10.2018, passed by the Hon'ble Court.

- We mentioned before the Hon'ble Court and the Hon'ble Court was pleased to allow the application for modification filed by the SCBA and passed the following order:
- "This application has been filed by Supreme Court Bar Association/respondent No. 2 seeking modification of our judgment dated 25.10.2018 passed in Writ Petition (C) No. 745 of 2018 and other connected matters to the extent that the block period mentioned in paragraph 25 of the judgment may be from June 01, 2011 to September 30, 2018 instead of October 01, 2013 to September 30, 2018. The applicant seeks further clarity in suggestion No. 6 mentioned in para 20 wherein the words 'State Government etc.' should be "State Government/Central Government" insofar as the AORs are concerned who have acted as AOR for any State Government etc.
- We modify the said paras accordingly meaning thereby that the block period mentioned in paragraph 25 of the judgment may be from June 01, 2011 to September 30, 2018 instead of October 01, 2013 to September 30, 2018 and the words 'State Government etc.' should be read as "State Government/Central Government" insofar as the AORs are concerned who have acted as AOR for any State Government etc. Interlocutory Application is disposed of accordingly."

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Toilets

- Shoe shiner machine is available in the Advocates Gents Toilet at first floor next to cafeteria, with cream for Black & Brown shiners for members' convenience.
- In R.K. Garg Chambers Block Gents Toilet and Ladies Toilet have been reconstructed.
- In A.K. Sen Chambers Block, new platform in Gents Toilets has been constructed. Shortage of water is sorted out in these toilets.
- Liquid soap dispensers were installed in all Gents and Ladies Toilets. They were diluted by staff with water, which virtually left with no soap therein. Now, this issue is well taken care of.
- Attendants have been deputed to look after the cleanliness of all toilets of the Chambers Blocks.

Wi-Fi

With the constant efforts of S.C.B.A., the Supreme Court Registry had finally granted contract to Reliance Jio on 14/15 November, 2018. Complete new infrastructure is likely to be installed in Supreme Court Building and all Chambers Block for High Speed Internet and better communication Network in another 4 to 6 weeks time.

Local Area Network (LAN) Provided By Supreme Court

On our constant requests to National Informatic Centre and the Supreme Court of India, they have extended the connectivity of Local Area Network (LAN) on the computers placed in Library-I, E-Research Library, Library-II, Ladies Bar Room, SCBA Office etc. with 1 GB speed via fiber optic. In this regard, cabling has been done and same has been functional. The actual cost was Rs.42 Lakhs, but it has been done free of cost for the members of the Bar.

Security

Security in the Chambers Blocks outside the Supreme Court campus has been upgraded. Proper lighting in M.C. Setalvad and C.K. Daphtary Chambers Block has been done.

Space for A.T.M.

Space for opening of New ATM of any other Bank other than UCO Bank has been granted. Punjab National Bank is ready and willing to start its A.T.M. in near future.

Caveat

SCBA has constantly requested Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India for Caveat Clearance fee of Rs.1500/- may be waived off. The Hon'ble Judges Rules Committee has approved it. In near future, it is likely to be notified.

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Reduction in Filing of Paper Books

Earlier, 1+3 paper books of SLPs used to be filed and in the event of defects 1+2 paper books were returned and after curing defects, the corrected copies 1+3 paper books were required. Thus, essentially 1+3+1=5 paper books were consumed. To check such wastage of paper and avoidable expenditure, I persuaded the Competent Authority to allow initial filing of 1+1 paper book and after necessary correction/removing defects the advocates has to file 1+3 paper books only. This was accepted and now 1+1 paper book has become an accepted norm.

ISSUES RAISED WITH THE HON'BLE CHIEF JUSTICE OF INDIA

Inadequate Medical Facilities At Delhi Government Dispensary

On 04.10.2018 Late Gunwant Dara, Advocate while attending the Court, felt uncomfortable and suddenly her health condition deteriorated and she needed urgent medical assistance. Due to inadequate medical facilities at Delhi Government Dispensary in Supreme Court premises, one of our members namely Ms. Sudha Gupta, Advocate took her to Delhi High Court Dispensary for urgent medical assistance. Doctors of Delhi High Court Dispensary referred her to Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital for further treatment but there she was declared "brought dead." In this regard, the undersigned had sent a letter dated 07.10.2018 to the Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India.

Further, the Executive Committee of SCBA met Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ranjan Gogoi, Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India on 10.10.2018 and informed Hon'ble C.J.I. about the inadequate medical facilities at the Delhi Government Dispensary.

In this regard, on 12.10.2018, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ranjan Gogoi, Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Madan B.Lokur, visited and inspected the medical facilities being provided in the Dispensary of Delhi Government opposite Post Office, along with President, Vice President, undersigned and other E.C. Members as well as Registry Officials.

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ranjan Gogoi, Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Madan B. Lokur have agreed, in principle, that the medical facility in its present condition needs immediate improvement and upgradation.

We have also requested to add the following facilities for emergency medical aid:

- 1. Semi Auto Analyzer for complete Lipid Profile, L.F.T.,
- 2. Cell Counter Analyzer Thyroid, K.F.T., Sugar etc.
- 3. Cardio A.E.D. (Automated External Defrillator)
- 4. Permanent posting of Specialist Doctor of Cardiology (Heart)
- 5. E.C.G. Machine
- 6. Ultrasound Machine
- 7. A proper ambulance with all paramedic facilities may be provided during working hours.

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Contribution of Rs. 20 Lakhs For Construction of First Complete Digitalized Library.

The Executive Committee is grateful to Mr. K.K. Venugopal, Ld. Attorney General for India, for his kind gesture of contributing Rs.20 lacs for construction of first complete Digitalized Library with 30 working-Computers Cubicles with Legal Softwares, about 10 Conference/Consultation Rooms and space for Journals and Magazines at N.C. Chatterjee Seminar Hall, C.K.Daphtary Chambers Block, Ground floor.

I am extremely happy to inform you that construction of digitized library is complete and now functional.

Contribution of Rs. 25 Lakhs For Construction of E-Research Library

I am grateful to Mr. Aman Lekhi, Ld. Additional Solicitor General of India for his kind gesture to contribute a sum of Rs.25,00,000/-(Rupees Twenty Five lakhs only), in memory of his father Late P.N. Lekhi, Senior Advocate, for setting up an e-Research Library at First Floor near Court Room No.4. It is fully equipped with latest International & National Legal Softwares, Computers, Scanners and Printers for the benefit of members, for which he has spent about Rs.15 lakhs. Mr. Aman Lekhi (Sr.) has further agreed to pay entire expenses for annual expenditure on the International and National Legal Softwares, Internet and other components including maintenance which is likely to be the tune of Rs.7 Lakhs.

Donation For An A/C Shuttle Bus

Ms. Mahalakshmi Pavani, Senior Advocate contributed Rs.13,50,000/- (Rupees Thirteen lakhs fifty thousand only) for purchase of an A/C Shuttle Bus for the Supreme Court Bar Association in the fond memory of Late Shri P.P.Rao, Senior Advocate. The Executive Committee is grateful to Ms. Mahalakshmi Pavani, Senior Advocate for this kind gesture.

C.A.T., N.G.T. Patiala House, Delhi High Court, Pragati Maidan Metro Station then back to Supreme Court Gate-D. Contribution By Mr. M.N. Rao (Sr.)

We are grateful to Mr. M.N. Rao, Senior Advocate for contributing Rs.10 lakhs towards SCBA Employees Welfare. This amount of Rs.10 lakhs has been kept in a fixed deposit permanently and the interest accrued on the Fixed Deposit will be utilized by the SCBA Employees Welfare & Medical needs.

WELFARE SCHEMES

Group Life Insurance Policy (LIC)

Keeping in mind the social security of our members, SCBA launched Group Life Insurance Policy from Life Insurance Corporation of India for its members with coverage of Rs.20 lacs. So far 571 members have taken this Group Life Insurance Policy, out of which 428 members have paid Rs.7080/- each and 143 members have got the Life Insurance Policy, having coverage of Rs.20 lakhs Free of Cost.

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Mediclaim Insurance Policy

We brought the Medical Insurance Policy during our tenure. We also invited the details of members along with their family members for medical insurance; so far SCBA office has received 160 total applications. Executive Committee is trying to bring Mediclaim Policy on concessional rates at the earliest.

Group Life Insurance Policy-2018 (GLIP)

Group Life Insurance Policy-2018 was implemented. This year SCBA paid Rs. 25,77,828/- to M/s. Aegon Life for 1295 active members of SCBA. The coverage of Rs.10 lacs for young members upto the age of 45 years and other members aged 46 to 65 with a coverage of Rs.5 lacs.

We are sad to inform that three members of SCBA covered under GLIP-2017, left for heavenly abode. SCBA stood with the family of the deceased members and handed over cheque of Rs.5 lakhs each, to their family members within four weeks.

The Executive Committee is thankful to Mr.Meenesh Kumar Dubey, Treasurer, for his tireless efforts to bring the said Policy.

Court Cost For Advocates Welfare Fund

SCBA received an amount of Rs.86,16,844/- from the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the matter of Contempt Petition No.374/2014 in Crl.Appeal No.1834/2013 Sita Ram Vs. Balbir @ Bali & Another, which shall be kept in a fixed deposit and the interest arising therefrom shall be disbursed for medical assistance to the members of the SCBA.

This year we received cost to the tune of Rs.37,86,310/- imposed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, which is being utilised in the Advocates Welfare Schemes.

Bank F.D.Rs.

This year, we have made an F.D.R. of Rs.13 Crores @ 7% interest per annum on 30.11.2018 and another F.D.R. of Rs.86,16,844/- @ 6.75 % interest per annum.

Inclusion of SCBA Members in CGHS

We sent a request letter dated 10.01.2018 to the Hon'ble Health Minister with request for inclusion of Members of SCBA for facilities of Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS). We are constantly pursuing the said issue with the Ministry.

We filed SLP before Hon'ble Supreme Court on 06.01.2018 against above said Ex-Parte Decree. The Hon'ble Supreme Court while granting Stay, directed SCBA to deposit Rs. 7 lacs in the Supreme Court Registry. Hon'ble Supreme Court finally disposed of the said SLP by the order dated 15.05.2018 directing to release a sum of Rs.6,28,000/- in favour of Mr. Mam Chand Sharma as a full and final settlement.

SCHEDULE - 18

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. The accounts are prepared on a going concern basis as per the historical cost convention.

2. Recognition of Income & Expenses

- a. Income from License Fees and Bank Interest are accounted for on accrual basis.
- b. All other incomes are accounted for on receipt/cash basis.
- c. Expenses are accounted for on accrual basis.

3. Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Cost includes original cost of acquisition including incidental expenses related to such acquisition and installation.

4. Depreciation

Depreciation on all fixed assets is provided on written down value method at the rates and in manner prescribed under Income Tax Act 1961 and the rules made there under. Depreciation on asset purchased through specific donation has been charged from the date they were put to use. Depreciation on such assets has not been charged to Income & Expenditure account; instead it has been set off against the donation received specifically.

5. Accounting for donation

a. Donations received for purchase/acquisition of specific asset are accounted for under head"Earmarked Funds" and shown in the Balance Sheet.



b. Donation including Court cost received for meeting out any specific object or events are reduced from related expense or accounted for as Income after completion of such object/ events. In cases where the donation has not been completely utilized, the funds have been classified as Earmarked funds or Financial Aid.

NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

1. The association had not maintained a fixed asset register erstwhile, however, a register is now being prepared showing full particulars, including quantitative details and situation of fixed assets; Fixed assets at selective location have been physically verified and numbered. In due course, all the fixed assets will be physically verified by the management in a phased periodical manner. The discrepancies, if any shall be appropriately dealt with upon the completion of the physical verification.

2. Contingent liabilities not provided for in respect of:

Legal cases are pending in various courts. In one of the cases, The trial court passed a decree suit on 30.05.2017 for a sum of Rs 6,63,591/- alongwith interest @ 14% per annum. Appropriate legal remedy was pursued by the association and the court took a security deposit of Rs 7,00,000/- from the association. The final order was passed on 15.05.2018, wherein the respondent was paid Rs 6,28,000/- and the balance was refunded to SCBA along with accrued interest. Accordingly, Rs 13,64,896/- debited by the bankers during F Y 2016-2017 at the order of the trial court and classified as library renovation expenses, was refunded to SCBA. The nrt refund amount of Rs 7,36,896/- has been adjusted against library renovation expense and classified as income in the books of account.

Liabilities for other cases have not been ascertained, pending final judgment of the Court.



- 3. Gratuity and leave encashment is paid to employees at the time of retirement and accounted for on cash basis. There is no accounting policy for provision in respect of accrual of gratuity and leave encashment liability.
- 4. An embezzlement of cash committed by some employee of Association came to the notice of Executive Committee during 2006-07. The matter is subject to police investigation and pending final judgment of the Hon'ble Court.
- 5. A Grant in Aid received from Government of India in the year 1999-2000, for the purpose of construction of Golden Jubilee Auditorium to mark the Golden Jubilee celebration of Supreme Court of India. The construction of the auditorium has not been commenced and the said grant money has been put into the fixed deposits (with scheduled bank) and interest earned thereon has not been considered as income instead has been added to the original amount of the Grant and treated as a liability. Ministry of Law and Justice (Department of Legal Affairs) vide its letter No F. No. B. 13017/4/199-Admn III (LA) Date 12th July 2012, 11th September 2012 and 31st October 2016 has advised the Association that the said grant amount be surrendered to Government of India along with interest accrued thereon. SCBA is pursuing this matter with the Government of India, for extension of time limit allotted for the utilization of said grant.
- 6. The Association has not registered itself under the ESIC act and hence no deduction or contribution being made under ESIC.
- 7. The association had received grants and donations which were partly used or not used during the financial year or outstanding from previous years. Donation received for Jaipur Conference more than 3 years ago has been transferred to the corpus fund. Rs 17,07,555/, received as financial aid few years ago has been transferred to library books fund account to be used for purchase and replenishment of library books.

- 8. Various amounts were appearing as recoverable/payable in the books of the association which was being highlighted by the auditors in their annual audit reports. The net balance after writing off the liabilities, which were no longer payable, and the recoverable which were no longer recoverable have been treated as income/expense in the accounts.
- 9. Association has been granted registration u/s 12 AA of Income Tax 1961 vide certificate No S- 2654/99/67. Association has claimed its income as being accumulated or set apart for specified purposes and therefore not made any provision for income tax (current & deferred) in its books of accounts.
- 10. Previous year figures have been regrouped or rearranged wherever considered necessary.
