B. Representations

1. The SCBA was registered on 25.08.1999 under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The purpose of the SCBA was elaborated in the case of Supreme Court Bar Association and Ors. v. B.D. Kaushik(2011) 13 SCC 774 (hereafter referred to as the "BD Kaushik Judgement") which described SCBA as "an association representing members regularly practicing in the court and responsible for proper conduct of its members in the court and for ensuring proper assistance to the court" in paragraph 28. - 5. Pursuant to the order of this Hon'ble Court dated 26.09.2011 in the case of SCBA vs B D Kaushik and as per order dated

Dear Shri Adish Aggarwala ji,

I have written 4 letters to you dated 06.10.2023, 30.10.2023, 28.12.2023 and 20.02.2024 requesting you to convene a proper meeting of the Executive Committee, SCBA to take decisions regarding various issues other than day to day administration of the Bar.

I have specifically mentioned about various decisions taken by Yourself and the Secretary without convening any meeting of the Executive and writing to the Hon'ble Chief Justice and other Hon'ble Judges, organizing programs as if they were decisions taken in the Executive Committee, when in fact they were decisions taken without the knowledge and information of the Members of the Executive. The said acts have farreaching consequences on the existence, accountability, neutrality, dignity and reputation of the Apex Bar of the Country.

I am pained to express that no Executive Committee meeting was held in the last 5 months and You, the Secretary and few persons are taking decisions and communicating to the Hon'ble Chief Justice in the pretext of EC meetings and regularly meeting the Hon'ble Judges and Registry Officials. You have also written letters to various authorities including Her Excellency the President of India without the knowledge of the Executive Committee which have seriously affected the dignity, independence and reputation of the SCBA.

Many serious issues and problems faced by the Members of the Bar, are not attended to by the Executive Committee so far. Day to day administration in regulating the activities of the Staff, improving the internet facilities and computer requirements in various libraries, RO water facilities in various chamber blocks, Parking and regulating the traffic in front of the Supreme Court on Bhagawan Das road and the new Chamber block in co-ordination with the traffic police, upgrading the library facilities, Medical, Health, Recreational and Insurance cover for members, organizing lectures and training programs for the young members of the Bar etc. are left unheeded and unattended.

This year main functioning of the SCBA has come down to organizing felicitation programs and farewell programs for the Hon'ble Judges, inauguration of the facilities graciously provided by the Hon'ble Chief Justice and the Hon'ble Judges Committee,

and organizing Cricket, Tennis and Badminton tournaments that too without decisions in the EC. These are important but a collective decision by the Executive have to be taken.

In my last letter dated 22.2.2024 I have requested you to convene a meeting of the Executive with an advance notice of seven days along with a proper agenda which is enclosed herewith.

Sadly, till today no meeting of the Executive Committee has been called nor any indication of any meeting has been given so far. In addition to that you and the Secretary are continuing with your own personal agendas and continuously writing letters to various authorities while keeping the Executive Committee in the dark. Even the date for the election to constitute the Gender Sensitization Committee and the selection of the names to the Election Committee for the same was announced without convening the meeting and consulting the Executive Committee, thereby making the elected Executive Committee redundant.

Under the aforesaid circumstances I call upon the Executive Committee headed by you to resign since we have failed to adhere to the basic democratic principles to be followed as an elected committee, in maintaining the dignity of the Bar and in discharging the responsibilities entrusted to us by the Members of the Bar.

I request the Executive Committee to hand over the responsibility of conducting fresh elections to the Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court consisting of Mr. Shekhar Naphade, Mr. V. Giri and Mr. SB Upadhyaya Sr, Advocates appointed as observers by the Hon'ble Court in the interest of the Bar.

However, to initiate the same, I hereby tender my resignation from the Executive Committee since I do not want to continue as a helpless Member of the present Executive Committee, silently witnessing and becoming a part of it.

This is in continuation to my 3 earlier letters to convene a proper Executive Committee meeting with proper agenda and advance communication. It is quite strange that no EC meeting is convened for the last 4 months. The tenure of the Executive is coming to an end by last week of April, 2024.

I would like to request you to convene a meeting of the Executive with advance 7 days' notice along with a proper agenda in which the following issues also may be included.

- 1. Audit report of the year as mentioned in Rule 31 of the SCBA Rules.
- 2. To finalize the Report of the functioning of the Executive Committee and the activities as mentioned in Rule 12 (f)of SCBA Rules.
- 3. Date for election to the gender sensitization Committee, as communicated by the concerned Registrar.
- 4. Proposed date of Annual General Body meeting and election to the Executive for the year 2023-24.
- 5. Appointment of the Election Committee to conduct the election to the Executive.
- 6. Allocation of necessary expenses for conducting the election including expenses for voting machines. In my opinion we have to go ahead with the Electronic Voting Machine to conduct and count the votes since due to large number of candidates are contesting for various posts and the Executive, it is difficult to print the ballot papers and to count the votes.

NOTE: Vide order dated 01.05.2023, this Hon'ble Court while hearing MA Diary No. 13992/2023 modified the above "Condition No. 9" as under:

"Only those members of the bar who are working as Mediators at the Supreme Court Mediation Centre, and have either physically or via video conferencing have conducted 20 mediation cases in two years, are to be considered eligible under the said condition no. 9."

In order to contest SCBA election for the following posts, minimum 10. number of appearances before the Supreme Court of India required be made as follows:

President: 100 lead appearances per year in the last two years.

Vice President: 100 lead appearances per year in the last two years.

Secretary: 50 appearances per year in the last two years.

Senior Executive Members: 50 lead appearances per year in the last two years.

NOTE: As per Rule 5 (vi)(c) of the SCBA Rules, to become a regular member of SCBA, after remaining 2 years as temporary member, a member should have atleast 5 lead appearance in each year in the past 2 years or atleast 20 appearances in each year of the two years period.

Fees for filing Nomination: The Candidate pays by Cheque/DD/Pay 11. Order along-with his/her nomination form the sum mentioned against the post for which he/she is seeking election be amended as follows:-

Sub: Representation to withdraw the suggestion of previous election committee to impose a condition of 20 mediation to become voter in SCBA.

Sir,

I am member of the SCBA having Membership No. K-490. I am giving present representation in regard to condition of 20 mediation cases to participate in the SCBA Election suggested by Election Committee, 2023 in Misc. Appl. D. No. 13992 filed in C.A. No. 3401/2003. The said suggestion was accepted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court vide order dated 01.05.2023.

The Election Committee, 2023, constituted for conducting the SCBA Election, had submitted to impose a condition of 20 mediation cases for mediators to participate in the SCBA Election and this Hon'ble Court accepted the same submission vide order dated 01.05.2023.

It is important to mention here that the Election Committee, 2023 was not competent authority to make any suggestion on behalf of SCBA as it was constituted to conduct election of SCBA as per the existing Rules of SCBA. The said Election Committee, 2023 was also not authorized by the Executive Committee, SCBA to participate in the proceeding or give suggestions to alter or amend the existing SCBA Rules.

Due to said suggestion made by the Election Committee, 2023 on behalf of SCBA by exceeding its' power and without considering its practical approach, the right of mediators panelled in the list of Supreme Court to participate in the SCBA Election has been Infringed

It is important to bring to the notice of this Hon'ble Court that no mediators have been getting 20 mediation cases from the mediation Center, Supreme Court therefore, no mediator can fulfil the condition of 20 mediation cases.

It is also important to mention here that no such condition is for Amicus Curiae or the advocates in the panel of legal Aid therefore, imposing a condition of 20 mediation cases is unfair and unjustified.

The condition of 20 mediation cases is not in the existing SCBA Rules therefore, it is not mentioned in the Final Questionnaire, 2024 by the present Executive Committee, SCBA.

The relevant portion of Final Questionnaire, 2024 is reproduced as follows:

Non AOR Members who are on the panel of mediators in the supreme Court mediation Center.

All members of the SCBA other than AORs who are working a mediator Center (During the preceding two calendar years i.e. 2022 and 2023). Please provide a copy of the letter of empanelment.).

It is, therefore, respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Court may be pleased to consider the present representation and prepare the report with a request to modify the order dated 01.05.2023 passed in Misc. Appl. D. No. 13992 filed in C.A. No. 3401.
